Key stage 4 Exam PE

OCR Cambridge Nationals Sports Studies was chosen to run alongside Edexcel GCSE PE in 2017. It was initially introduced as an alternative for students who enjoyed PE but who were not always as practically able as GCSE requires.

However, since then, the department believes that this is the most suitable pathway for our current cohorts.

All students have the opportunity to choose to study PE as one of their options on the understanding that they have a good track record of participating in PE and regularly brining their full school PE kit to lessons.

Students are given a brief talk outlining the requirements of studying PE and course expectations. They are made aware that they will sit an external exam in either June of year 10 or January of year 11.

The course is course work heavy so students should not expect to have a significant amount of practical lessons.

Grading is also different from GCSE ranging from :
